Paid Internship at the Jackie Clarke Museum and Library in Ballina, Co. Mayo

The graduate-level internships provide opportunities for professional development in Irish Studies while living and working abroad. Interns serve as Archives Assistants at the museum, which houses a unique and important collection of manuscripts, printed materials and artifacts. Advanced undergraduates may also apply.

O'Shaughnessy Internship Program in Dublin

The Center for Irish Studies seeks to place three student interns for a new 8-week summer internship program. Two students will be placed in the Houses of the Oireachtas. A third student will hold another internship in an Irish business or organization. The politics interns will each serve the office of a Member of the Oireachtas (TD or Senator). The program will provisionally run from May 29 to July 22, 2024.

Summer Dublin EYE (Early Years' Experience) Internship

The Summer Dublin EYE provides first-year Villanova students the unique opportunity to explore and challenge their career assumptions through a 3-credit international work experience in Dublin, Ireland, while also introducing them to the various forms of expressions of traditional and contemporary Irish identity and culture through a 3-credit course on literature, music, and the arts.

Summer Studio in Irish Theater

From the studio to the stage, graduate students will study the workings and history of Ireland's world-class national theatre while developing their own theatre skills, knowledge, and practice.

Thursday, March 14: Emilie Pine, Charles A. Heimbold, Jr. Chair of Irish Studies, Reading

Join us for our annual reading and talk, from the 2024 Charles A. Heimbold, Jr., Chair for Irish Studies, Emilie Pine, as part of the Villanova Literary Festival. Dr. Pine is both a creative writer and a scholar. She serves as Professor of Modern Drama in the School of English, Drama and Film at University College Dublin.

Prior to her breakout collection of essays, *Notes to Self*, which won the 2018 Irish Book of the Year award, she published *The Politics of Irish Memory: Performing Remembrance in Contemporary Irish Culture* (Palgrave, 2011) and served as editor of the *Irish University Review* 2017-2021. She is widely regarded as a leading scholar of Irish cultural memory and has recently published *The Memory Marketplace: Witnessing Pain in*



Contemporary Theatre (2020) and led a project to witness Ireland's history of institutional abuse (https://industrialmemories.ucd.ie). She continues to runs the ongoing oral-history project, Survivors Stories, with the National Folklore Collection and has collaborated on a

performance, *All Hardest of Woman,* at the National Maternity Hospital. Her first play, *Good Sex*, was shortlisted for Best New Play at the 2023 *Irish Times* Irish Theatre Awards. Her novel *Ruth & Pen* (2022) won the 2023 Kate O'Brien First Novel Award.

Wednesday, March 27: Lunch @ Lepage - "Fasting Protests and Hunger Strikes" with Dr. Joseph Lennon

In partnership with the **LePage Center for History in the Public Interest**, Dr. Joseph Lennon will give an overview of the origins of the modern hunger strike. Fasting protests have long traditions in Ireland, India, and Russia, but they were transformed in 1909 London. Marion Wallace-Dunlop, fighting for women's right to vote, led the first hunger-strike campaign. This talk focuses on links between these traditions

and her life and is based on his forthcoming book, *Marion Wallace-Dunlop and the Origins of the Hunger Strike* (SUNY Press 2025).
