She has been primarily university educated in the United States. She has been awarded honorary Doctorate degrees from University of Nigeria, Eastern Connecticut University, Drexel University, Yale University, John Hopkins University.

The name Chimamanda is primarily a female name of African - Nigeria origin that means My God Will Not Fall/Fail Me.
