Other Ways to Earn Credit

Villanova has a special program for people who have knowledge of certain subjects but don't have the college credits to prove it. Through the College of Arts and Sciences' Credit by Examination program, you can pass a departmental exam, satisfy the Villanova Part-Time Studies program's requirements and earn the credits for a particular course. FastForward at Villanova!

These exciting, accelerated hybrid courses combine in class with online learning and meet for seven weeks on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday evenings or Saturday mornings or afternoons. Each class session meets for 3 1/2 hours and is supplemented with online instruction. FastForward 3 meets in early January through March 1; FastForward 4 meets early March through May 1.
