DUAL ADMISSIONS INTENT FORM

Montgomery County Community College (MCCC) and Villanova University enter into this Dual Admission and Core-to-Core Transfer Agreement to facilitate the transfer of MCCC students into Villanova University's Bachelor of Interdisciplinary Studies Degree program (BIS) for part-time students. Under the Dual Admissions Agreement, MCCC students will be guaranteed admission into the BIS degree program with junior status at Villanova University on the condition that they:

- graduate from MCCC with an Associate of Art (A.A.) or Associate of Science (A.S.);
- complete a "Dual Admissions Intent" form before graduation from MCCC;
- do not attend another institution of higher-education between the time they graduate from MCCC and enroll at Villanova University in the BIS degree program;
- and satisfy all other Villanova University transfer requirements for part-time study.

The Dual Admission Program and Core-to-Core Transfer Agreement with Villanova University is limited to the part-time Bachelor of Interdisciplinary Studies Degree.

By satisfying the conditions of the Dual Admissions Agreement, Villanova University's Office of Part-Time Studies will do the following:

1. Waive the \$25 application fee.
2. Advise the student of the significant tuition savings available at Villanova University for academic programs and courses offered in the evening, the availability of Phi Theta Kappa Scholarships for part-time students, and their potential eligibility for need-based financial aid and other types of financial assistance.
3. Provide the MCCC student with the opportunity to meet with a Villanova University BIS program representative on a regular basis for advising and assistance with transferring.

You, the student, may void this agreement at any time with written notification to MCCC and Villanova University.

Please complete the following information and return it to the Office of Admissions and Records, MCCC, College Hall, Central Campus or Room 151 at the West Campus. You will receive a letter of confirmation from Villanova University's Office of Part-Time Studies in the near future.

- **General Studies**

Students with a major in “General Studies” will take advanced courses in one of the following areas: Humanities, Social Sciences, or Independent General Studies (self-defined major). *Humanities Area includes courses in:* Art History, Classical Studies, Communication, Education, English, French, German, History, Peace & Justice, Philosophy, Theology, Spanish, Theatre. *Social Sciences Area includes courses in:* Economics, Geography, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology. - **Information Systems**

The “Information Systems” major emphasizes the application of computing technology in today’s workplace. You will be challenged to program, work with database systems, and understand computer and system designs while also studying business areas such as financial information systems and enterprise resource planning (ERP). This major is ideal for adult students who wish to make use of technology to effectively meet the needs of a business, industry and/or organization. Too often individuals have a myopic technology view or business specific knowledge. This major will develop your skills to bridge an important gap needed in today’s evolving and maturing marketplace. The curriculum requires a combination of core courses and courses from the Department of Computing Sciences and the Department of Decision and Information Technologies. In addition, there are Information Systems courses designed specifically for this major. Required for the major are 10 courses from the above areas and 5 courses in Information Systems Environment (courses will be designed to reflect the interests of students, *i.e.*, pharmaceuticals, local governments, small business, enterprise resource planning/ERP, human resources, and manufacturing). **For more information please go to www.parttime.villanova.edu/programs.**

- **Leadership Studies**

The Leadership Studies major is designed to address key issues most important for leaders in today’s corporate arena. These areas include globalization, rapid scientific and social change, advances in technology and the growing diversity in the workforce, clientele, strategic partners, and community. Depending on your personal and professional interest, students will also be able to fill in free electives with courses in business, information systems, communication, and others.
