Transferring into Villanova Part-Time Studies

If you have credits from any accredited college or university they will be given serious consideration. Students from local community colleges in Delaware, Montgomery, Bucks and Philadelphia counties regularly transfer into Villanova Part-Time Studies. You can transfer up to 60 credits toward your Villanova bachelor's degree.

Other Ways to Earn Credit

Villanova has a special program for people who have knowledge of certain subjects but don't have the college credits to prove it. Through the College of Arts and Sciences Credit by Examination program, you can pass a departmental exam, satisfy the Villanova Part-Time Studies program requirements and earn the credits for a particular course. Another way to get credit for what you've learned in life is through the College Level Examination Program (CLEP). If you are enrolled in a degree program in the College of Arts & Sciences, you can participate in an internship and earn credit for learning at your place of employment. VILLANOVA OFFERS FLEXIBLE SCHEDULING OPTIONS

FastForward at Villanova!

These accelerated hybrid courses combine in class with online learning and meet for seven weeks on Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday evenings or Saturday mornings or afternoons. Each class session meets for 3.5 hours and is supplemented with online instruction. FastForward 1 meets in late August through early October; FastForward 2 meets mid October through early December. Fourteen FastForward courses are offered in fall 2009!

Evenings/Saturdays

Choose classes that meet one night per week, FastForward courses that meet for seven weeks (weeknights or Saturday mornings or afternoons) and one credit weekend seminars (Friday evenings and all day, Saturdays) are also available during the summer and fall semesters.

Summer Session

Continue your studies year-round by enrolling in the eight-week summer evening session.

Distance Education
