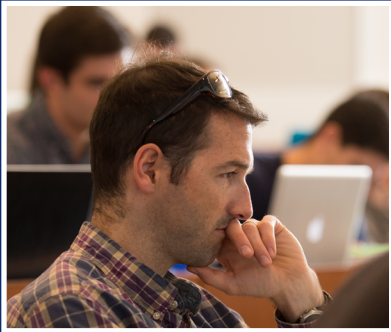

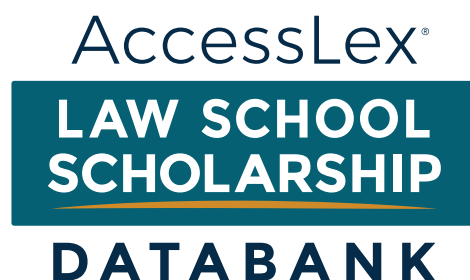

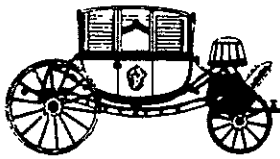

WILLIAM GOLDMAN FOUNDATION

1. The William Goldman Foundation provides a partial scholarship program for graduate and or medical students. Our requirements are:
(1) Applicant must be in the top 1/3 of their class, (2) Must be a full time matriculating graduate student, (3) Must have a great financial need. (4) Student must have completed first year of graduate study.
The Scholarship is awarded in various amounts toward tuition fees only.

The applicant must attend graduate and/or medical school of one of the following institutions: Bryn Mawr College, Drexel University, Drexel University College of Medicine, Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine, Temple University, Thomas Jefferson University and Medical College, University of Pennsylvania, or Villanova University.
4. Awards are made annually commencing with the fall semester. There are no mid-year awards.
5. Do not submit the application until you have completed your first year of graduate study at one of the above schools.
6. Applications must be filed no later than March 15, but additional information, such as transcripts and tax returns, may be supplied as late as April 30th.
7. NO APPLICATION, WHETHER A RENEWAL OR AN ORIGINAL APPLICATION WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER THE MARCH 15TH DEADLINE.
8. If you meet our requirements, you will be requested, by mail, to appear for a personal interview. An interview will not be scheduled for any applicant unless a copy of the applicant's Federal Income Tax Return, your parents Federal Income Tax Return, (even if the applicant is self supporting) for the last calendar year, and a transcript of the final year of undergraduate, and the entire academic record of the graduate school have been submitted.
9. All financial and other information submitted in connection with this scholarship application is for the use of the Foundation only, and will be held in the strictest of confidence.
10. Evaluations will be based primarily upon academic performance, class standing, financial need, and potential future contribution to the Philadelphia community.
11. A new application must be submitted each year for renewal consideration. This renewal application must also be filed no later than March 15th., except for undergraduate transcripts and references, which need not be re-submitted.
12. Applications must be mailed no later than March 15th.

2026 Alford Excellence Award

In honor of Haile L. Alford, the first African-American female judge in the State of Delaware, the Multicultural Judges and Lawyers Section of the Delaware State Bar Association will grant the 2026 Alford Excellence Award to at least three future practitioners who will sit for the February 2026 or July 2026 Delaware Bar Examination. Judge Alford was appointed by Governor Mike Castle in 1992 and served on the bench until her untimely death in 2003 at the age of 54. Each 2026 Alford Excellence Award will be in the amount of \$3,500.

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

Application materials include: (1) the 2026 Alford Excellence Award Application, including submission of a resume and law school transcript(s), (2) a personal essay (1,000 word limit), (3) at least one, but no more than three, recommendation letter, and (4) proof of a submitted application for the bar. Applicants may submit the application materials in multiple submissions, but all materials, except for proof of a submitted bar application, **must** be submitted by the deadline of **April 1, 2026**. An application package with missing materials by the application deadline shall be deemed incomplete and ineligible for consideration by The Alford Excellence Award Selection Committee.

Part I

2026 Alford Excellence Award Application: Applicants must submit the attached application to highlight their superior academic credentials, leadership qualities, commitment to community service, and intent to actively practice law in the State of Delaware. Applicants must complete all of the requested information in the application and include their résumé and a copy of their transcript(s) (unofficial copies are acceptable). Applicants may also include copies of other relevant documents, such as awards, recognition certificates, etc.

Part II

Personal Essay: Applicants must submit a persuasive essay highlighting their demonstrated leadership abilities, commitment to community service, personal barriers that have been overcome, and/or providing examples of academic achievements, awards and certificates, personal qualities, and character. In addition, applicants **must** address (1) why they desire to actively practice law in the State of Delaware and/or their ties/commitment to the State of Delaware, and (2) how they will personally commit to diversity, equity, and inclusion as a member of the Delaware bar. As a reminder, this scholarship is intended to help defray the cost of sitting for the Delaware Bar Exam.

Part III

Recommendation Letter: Each applicant must submit at least one, but no more than three, recommendation letter, highlighting how the applicant meets any/all of the criteria mentioned above. Letters of recommendation can either be submitted directly by the recommender to the email address listed below, or as part of an applicant's application materials.

Part IV

Proof of Submitted Bar Application: Each scholarship recipient is required to submit proof of a submitted bar application to sit for the July Delaware Bar Exam or proof of a submitted application to have sat for the February Delaware Bar Exam **by May 6, 2026**. Failure to do so will lead to forfeiture of the scholarship.

THE 2026 IRVIN STANDER AWARD

The Philadelphia Bar Association – Workers’ Compensation Section is pleased to announce that it is seeking nominations for the annual **Irvin Stander Award**. This award is given by the Section in memory of Workers’ Compensation Judge Irvin Stander, a Philadelphia Judge who was well known for his prolific writings on Workers’ Compensation and Zoning law. Judge Stander was also a founder of the first law school course on Workers’ Compensation at Temple University Law School, now the Temple University Beasley School of Law.

The **Irvin Stander Award** recognizes an outstanding graduating law student who has demonstrated legal acumen or scholarship in the areas of Administrative Law or Workers’ Compensation. The award committee is seeking an individual who has a demonstrated passion for Administrative or Workers’ Compensation Law, shown through academic excellence in an Administrative Law or Workers’ Compensation Law school class, related employment, internship, publications, or other activities, and has a significant connection to the Philadelphia area. The recipient of this prestigious award will receive a \$2,500.00 prize to defray the cost of the annual bar examination, as well as a plaque commemorating this honor.

In addition to being considered for the **Irvin Stander Award**, all eligible applicants will also receive sponsorship for this year to the Philadelphia Bar Association and membership to the Workers’ Compensation Section of the Association.

See the requirements and documentation necessary set forth below.



The requirements for the **Irvin Stander Award** are as follows:

- 1) The applicant must be a law student during the application period who is anticipated to graduate from law school prior to the Pennsylvania Bar Examination in July 2026.
- 2) The applicant must be currently enrolled and actively attending a law school located in Philadelphia, Bucks, Montgomery, Delaware, or Chester counties in Pennsylvania, or the applicant may be a law school student currently enrolled and actively attending a law school at any location in the United States who is a resident of Philadelphia or has demonstrated a connection to the Philadelphia area.
- 3) If the applicant does not attend a law school located in Philadelphia, Bucks, Montgomery, Delaware, or Chester counties in Pennsylvania, the applicant must include in his or her personal statement their connection to the Philadelphia area.
- 4) The scholarship recipient will be awarded the \$2,500.00 scholarship in a timely fashion to provide financial assistance towards the recipient's Pennsylvania bar examination review course. The scholarship recipient will also be invited to an upcoming event hosted by The Philadelphia Bar Association – Workers' Compensation Section for the presentation of the award and plaque. Attendance is required, barring exigent circumstances that are determined to be an acceptable excuse by the Executive Committee of the Philadelphia Bar Association – Workers'



Compensation Section. Failure to attend the award presentation event, barring exigent circumstances that are determined to be acceptable by the Executive Committee of the Philadelphia Bar Association - Workers' Compensation Section, may result in the forfeiture of the award at the discretion of the Executive Committee of the Philadelphia Bar Association - Workers' Compensation Section.

The following documentation is required from the applicant:

- 1) A cover letter addressed to the Philadelphia Bar Association – Workers' Compensation Section - Awards Subcommittee. The cover letter should clearly state the applicant's name, mailing address, e-mail address, and landline or cell phone number.
- 2) A resume.
- 3) An official law school transcript.
- 4) One letter of recommendation, preferably from an Administrative or Workers' Compensation Law professor who taught the applicant. If the applicant is unable to obtain a recommendation from that teacher, a letter of recommendation from any law school professor, employer, or mentor, if the letter includes information on the applicant's interest, work, and/or aptitude relating to Workers' Compensation/Administrative Law. No more than one letter of recommendation will be considered. No personal letters of recommendation will be considered.
- 5) A personal statement that introduces the applicant and explains why the applicant is deserving of the award, why the applicant is interested



in Workers' Compensation/Administrative Law, the applicant's connection to the Philadelphia area, and how Workers' Compensation/Administrative Law aligns with the applicant's future goals. The word limit is 250 words.

- 6) The application period runs from Monday, February 2, 2026, through Friday, May 1, 2026. All applications must be received by the Awards Subcommittee on or before May 1, 2026.
